You're not in the Picture if You're not in the (Sampling) Frame: Prepare to be Counted!

The Census Bureau collects data for over 100 surveys. An alphabet soup of state local programs work to create the sampling frame for all of these - LUCA, PSAP, BAS, CCC, NC, are critical to a sample that maximizes accuracy and minimizes under counting. Local communities, prepare to be counted!

once, and in the right place**

LUCA

(Does anyone live here? - Where is here?)

- **L**ocal **U**ppdate of **C**ensus **A**ddresses

- The only opportunity for tribal, state, county, city, townships to review and comment on the Census Bureau's residential address list prior to the Decennial Census. Governments lacking resources may ask a higher level entity to conduct the review (including regional planning agencies)

- Every 10 years

- The timeframe:

January 2017

Notification

December 2017

Registration Ends

June 2018

Changes Due

August 2019

Review Ends

PSAP

Where's the line (and how do I know when I've crossed it)

- **P**articipant **S**tatistical **A**reas **P**rogram
- Every 10 years

Allows invited participants to review and update statistical area boundaries

- Tribal Census Tracts
- Tribal Block Groups
- Census Designated Places
- Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas
- Tribal Statistical Areas
- OTSA tribal subdivisions
- Tribal Designated Statistical Areas
- State Designated Tribal Statistical Areas

BAS and BASNRFU

(Is this still Astoria? Or have I cross into Dutch Kills?)

- **B**oundary and **A**nnexation **S**urvey
- **B**oundary and **A**nnexation **S**urvey **N**onresponse **F**ollow-up
 - Incorporated places - cities, towns, boroughs, villages
 - Townships and towns
 - Counties or equivalent
 - Consolidated cities
 - Roads and other linear features
 - Update legal boundaries and names
 - Can't know how many live there if you don't where there is.
 - Boundaries change - Annexation happens
- Annual (it's every year!)
 - Mailings go out in January

NC

- **N**ew **C**onstruction

- Allows tribal, state, and local governments to update CB's residential address list with living quarters under construction
- Every 10 years
 - April 2019 – December 2019

CCC

- **C**omplete **C**ount **C**ommittees
 - Create community awareness
 - Educate
 - Promote
 - Every 10 years
 - Locally based
 - Targeted outreach
 - Can be Governmental or non-governmental

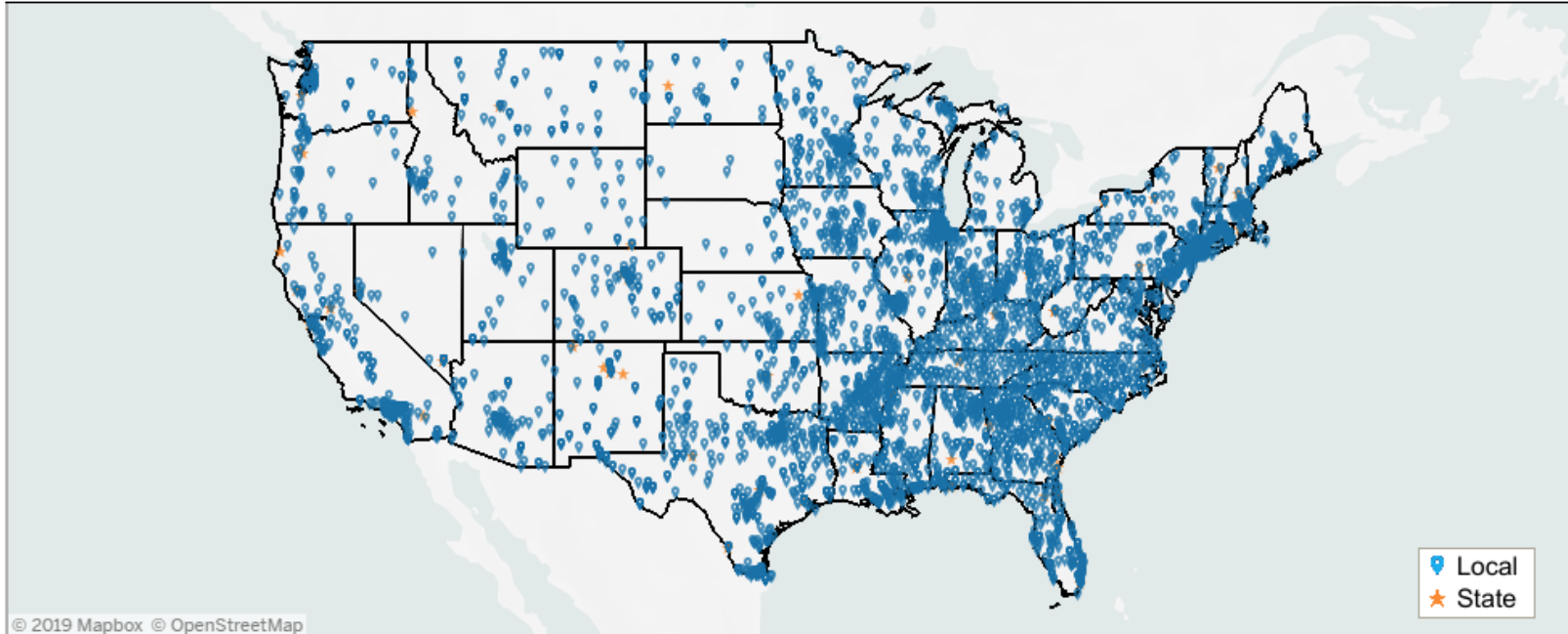

CCC

(Sometimes called SCCCs – **S**tate CCCs)

- **C**omplete **C**ount **C**ommissions:
 - Organized at the tribe or state level
 - Tribal leader, governor, or highest elected official determines the structure
 - Commissions receive more extensive training
 - Administered through Census Bureau's regional offices



SDRP

(Why is that house across the street worth so much more than mine?)

- **S**chool **D**istrict **R**eview **P**rogram
- Review and update school district boundaries
 - State officials
- Annually
 - Begins in August
- Matters because:
 - Federal funding, including Title I



GSS

- **G**eographic **S**upport **S**ystem
 - Allows continuous submission of:
 - Addresses
 - Road data
- Tribal, state, and local governments
- Continuous

State Data Center Program

- Began in 1978 with just a few states.
- Often located at research universities, libraries, state government, etc.



The State Data Center Program is a...

- Partnership between the Census Bureau and the states
- Network of data professionals who provide data assistance, training, and presentations
- The Premier Local Partner and an official source of Census Bureau data



State Data Center Network

Nationally:

- 56 Lead Data Centers
- 9 Person Steering Committee
 - Elected to three-year terms
 - Serve two consecutive terms before rotating off

State Networks:

- Created by the Lead
 - 225 Coordinating Agencies
 - Usually 1-3 per state
 - 1,400 Affiliates
 - Number based on population
